

Committee People

Committee people are volunteers who help coordinate the Democratic Party in their voting precinct. As such, they are also automatic members of the Lancaster County Democratic Committee. Committee people are elected to four-year terms, in synch with gubernatorial elections. Committee people can also be appointed by the District Leader to fill a vacancy between elections.

Each voting precinct can have two democratic committee people, who share the following responsibilities in their precinct:

- Greeting voters at the polls on election days
- Being a resource for voter registration and absentee ballot materials
- Circulating candidate nominating petitions
- Distributing campaign materials

Becoming a committee person is easier than you think. Volunteers simply need 10 registered democrats in their precinct to sign a ballot petition and then receive at least 10 votes from democrats in their precinct during the gubernatorial election. No campaign materials or expenses are required to become a committee person.

While becoming a committee person may be the easiest elected position to win, it is one of the most important because committee people are the foundation of the Democratic Party.
